THE TONE

Warm, human and honest — like explaining something to a friend, not reading ad copy. No hype, no hard sell. The sentences are short because they are spoken, not read. Let them breathe.

READING NOTES

Each line is timed to what happens on screen. The duration on the left is how long that line has in the picture — treat it as a target, not a cage. The gaps between lines are real silence in the cut; you do not need to fill them.

HOW TO SAY IT

Revel	REV -uhl — as in “revelry”. Never “re-VEL”.
lets revel dot io	Written out on purpose. Say it as the address: “let’s revel dot I-O”.
R S V P	Spelled out, letter by letter: “are-ess-vee-pee”.
Q R code	Spelled out: “cue-are code”.
V A T	Spelled out: “vee-ay-tee”.
Stripe	The payment company. English, as written.
Mira, Ren, Noa, Jordan, Bea, Lena, Felix, Paul	Characters in the demos. Say them naturally.

PART 1 — WELCOME TO REVEL

1 This is Revel — the free, open-source event platform for communities, clubs and independent venues. Let's take a quick tour.

PART 4 — POTLUCK & DIETARY NEEDS

9 Tell Revel how you eat once, on your profile — a preference like vegetarian, and an allergy, with how serious it is. You choose what gets shared. Then the host opens their event and sees only the totals: enough to cook for everyone, without reading a single private detail. And when the meal is a potluck, the plan lives on that same page. See a gap, claim it, and the list updates for everyone.

10 And there's much more than this. Waitlists and invitations, on every event you run. Revenue and V A T, worked out for you. Your own venues, with their own seating maps. And every ticket and attendee in one place. Cash at the door, a bank transfer, or card online. All of it tracked the same way.
